Retired Canadian Forces Captain Appointed to the North East LHIN Board

October 27, 2010 -- North East LHIN Interim Chair and CEO Louise Paquette welcome Danielle Bélanger-Corbin of Haileybury for a three year term as the Director for the Cochrane/Timiskaming Hub Area.

Danielle is a decorated retired Canadian Forces Captain who served as a Senior Functional Analyst and Manager with National Defence's Material Information Management Systems (MIMS) until her retirement in 2000. She currently works as a Medical Office Manager in New Liskeard, as well as, owns and operates a private equestrian training facility. Her business interests have also led her to take the role of president of B³G² Investors Group, a corporation which focused on real estate ventures, for two years ending in January of this year.

Not only is Danielle a fluently bilingual Francophone who has help found and served on the boards of arts organizations in her community, such as FrancoCiné and Festival des Folies FrancoFun, but her knowledge of three other languages –Spanish, Italian, and German—has also aided her with her volunteer work as an ESL teacher. Danielle has a long history of volunteering in her community whether it be coaching youth on the soccer fields and on the ski trails, helping those on low incomes complete their income tax forms, or serving as a board member of the South Temiskaming Active Travel Organization.
